#### Miles for Mosaic – Sponsored Fun Run - Friday 26th April 2024 In aid of Mosaic Family Support charity

You will be aware, from my letter last week, that this Friday all children will be taking part in Friday a sponsored Fun Run during the school day. We have teamed up with around twenty other local schools to take part in this year's Miles for Mosaic event, raising much-needed funds for Mosaic Family Support charity.

Founded in 2007, Mosaic Family Support charity was created to fill the gap in bereavement provision across the county. Prior to this, support for bereaved children and young people was limited as the only support available was from hospices offering support after the death of someone suffering from a long-term illness. Mosaic support children and young people who have been bereaved of someone special, such as a parent, sibling, friend or a member of their extended family. This includes all causes of death such as long-term illness, sudden death, suicide, murder or road traffic accident. All of this incredible work, of which St Mary's families have relied upon in the past, comes at a great cost to the charity and, as such, your support is hugely appreciated.

The run will take place just before lunchtime on Friday 26th April and children will be encouraged to run or walk laps of the entire school grounds, whilst being cheered on by the staff and their peers. Children will run for no more than fifteen minutes and we will have a counting system which records how many laps we complete in total so that we can celebrate how far they run altogether. Rest-assured that no child will be forced to run and we will do our upmost to make this a fun and memorable experience!
