Communication is Key!



St Mary's has used Tapestry for some time to communicate TAPESTRY messages and learning updates directly from teachers to parents.

As we strive to move to a more consistent form of communication and look to save money across our school, we will be moving away from Tapestry for most of our year groups.

Only Reception (Willow) class will now be using Tapestry and this will only be used to share elements of their Early Years learning journey. At the end of their Reception year, children's Tapestry accounts will be made inactive.

Email will now replace Tapestry for all children beyond Reception and will be used in Reception to communicate messages.



Some of you will have become used to communicating and receiving positive alerts linked to your child's achievements via Class Dojo, of late.

We have reviewed our use of Class Dojo and whilst we love the ability to send positive alerts to parents' phones, the integrated communication tool was similar to instant messaging and therefore became unmanageable and difficult to monitor.

We have, therefore, decided to move to a new app called 'Marvellous Me'. This will enable parents to receive instant alerts in their app when 'thumbs ups' or 'badges' are virtually awarded to the children in school. Lots more details and guides will follow shortly, along with your log in details!
