Last Tuesday, seven of our Key Stage Two children took part in the Dorchester Town Schools Football Tournament. They performed fantastically and were superb representatives for our school. We are very proud!

It has been lovely seeing so many parents in school this week, meeting with our teachers for parent consultation meetings. As you know, we trialled whole-day consultations this time and we would love to hear your feedback on this.

On Wednesday, we welcomed many of our Reception parents for Willow's first Class Assembly. As expected, they were an absolute delight and spread a great deal of joy throughout school with their wonderful speaking, singing and artwork.

Next week we are taking part in Walk to School Week. This nationwide event is designed to help pupils experience first-hand the importance of leading an active lifestyle. This year's challenge, The Magic of Walking, encourages children to travel actively to school every day of the week. They'll learn about the importance of walking and the difference it can make for individuals, communities and the planet. Each class will work collectively to make as many active journeys to school as possible across the week. URRICULUM OPEN MORNING

On Thursday morning, next week, we will once again be inviting all parents to come into school with their children from 08:45 until 09:15.

The purpose of this event is to allow you all to have a valuable insight into what our new curriculum offers to our children. You will be able to experience a small snapshot of school life for your child and also get to see their learning environment.

If you have multiple children in our school, please feel free to visit each classroom in turn. All St Mary's children must stay in their own classroom, so please do not take them around the school with you. At 09:15, we will kindly ask the children to say their goodbyes to you as they will need to move to their first lesson of the day at 09:20.

Please note that this event starts at 08:45 so that children can be registered first. This is in the interest of your child's safety. Please send your child in as normal from 08:30 and then wait outside before joining them at 08:45.

TRANSFER DAY

On Thursday 4th July, we will be hosting our annual Transfer Day when children in school will spend the day with their next teacher, in their next classroom.

Year Four children who are transferring to St Osmund's or Dorchester Middle School will need to be dropped off to and collected from their new schools on that day - they won't attend St Mary's that day. Details to follow shortly.

All other children will come to school as normal, but we will ask for you to drop off to and pick up from your child's new classroom. You will all be notified of your child's new class after the May half term break. The following day, on Friday 5th July, the children will return to their current classes for the remainder of the school year.

We know this can be a worrying time, but rest-assured we will do all we can to make this a positive experience.



I would like to say a huge thank you to School Association and our wonderful volunteers who helped to install a new shed last weekend. Some of you may have noticed that we are working hard to transform our Reception outdoor learning space and the sheds are a part of this project.

Over half term, the fencing around the Reception outdoor area will be changed and this has meant that we have had to give back our clothes recycling bank. Once the work is completed, we will consider whether we can rehouse another one in future.

This fencing work will include installing a separate walkway for access to the preschool through the space, alongside the new sheds, enabling us to maximize our use of the Reception outdoor area throughout the day. Access to Reception will not change.

We are really excited about creating our own royal portraits for ourselves, adding digital paint methods to our royal poses.

...we have been learning about light, shadows, and reflections in Science and exploring Indian dance with Mrs Paine. We have also been typing up our news reports.
