This is a summary of how our school delivers music education to all our pupils across three areas – curriculum music, co-curricular provision and musical experiences – and what changes we are planning in future years. This information is to help pupils and parents or carers understand what our school offers and who we work with to support our pupils' music education.

Part A: Curriculum music

This is about what we teach in lesson time, how much time is spent teaching music and any music qualifications or awards that pupils can achieve.

At St Mary's music develops our pupils' imagination and creativity, we provide opportunities for them to learn through music as well as about it. They develop their understanding of the musical elements and learn how music is structured by listening to music from different cultures and eras. They learn to use the technical vocabulary for these elements and as their confidence builds they enjoy the performance and compositional aspects of music.

- There is a whole school curriculum in place which clearly maps progress and skills across the key stages. Additional aspects are embedded into the planning such as whole class instrumental music, school performances and special musical events ●
 There are regular timetabled curriculum music lessons in all years plus other provision which totals 1 hour per week for all children (can include singing assemblies etc)
- Our curriculum is adapted to meet the needs of children with additional needs and/or disabilities, and these bespoke adaptations ensure that music can be enjoyed by all.
- The Model Music Curriculum inspired our curriculum, which is informed by the non-statutory National Curriculum Guidance.
- Children have the opportunity to sing within lessons and in worship. Children have the opportunity to learn, play and improve their skills with tuned percussion, but we also have access to class sets of instruments through the Dorset Music service. During 2023-24 Year 4 had Samba drum lessons and we are intend to offer the same to the Year4 from the current cohort
- Progress is recorded using video/audio recordings or written notes to assess.
- Children have the opportunity to play a musical instrument in the EYFS outdoor area, as well as a weekly music lesson.

Part B: Co-curricular music

This is about opportunities for pupils to sing and play music, outside of lesson time, including choirs, ensembles and bands, and how pupils can make progress in music beyond the core curriculum.

- At St Mary's we offer peripatetic tuition in guitar, piano, violin and drums to children year one and above.
- We hope to start a school choir which will be for years 1 to 4 in the second half of the autumn term.
- We take part in the year4 Wessex music hub annually.

Part C: Musical experiences

This is about all the other musical events and opportunities that we organise, such as singing in assembly, concerts and shows, and trips to professional concerts.

- Children take part in a whole school musical performance every Christmas
- Children sing in the Carol Service in church
- Children have a weekly Songs and Praise
- Children have the opportunity to help lead groups from the front in Songs and Praise.
- Children have a musical performance from Dorset Music Service annually

In the future

This is about what the school is planning for subsequent years.

- Timetabled curriculum music of at least one hour each week of the school year for key stages 1 to 2 This will continue.
- Access to lessons across a range of instruments, and voice. This will continue
- A school singing group is to be developed
